**Section “C” Workshop**—16 hours of intense classroom instruction through lecture, group discussion, and practice exercises. The course covers the fundamentals of site design, land planning, circulation and parking, and problem-solving techniques applied to example exercises. Exercises of increasing difficulty will be given and reviewed during the course. Each student will receive a 48-page LARE Section C Guide with information pertinent to Section C and a minimum of 20 exercises and vignettes. Individual feedback will be given to candidates as they work the problems. Real time desk critiques are part of the class. Several vignettes will then be reviewed by the class as a whole. The instructor will provide tips on how to break problems down and conceptualize a plan of attack for developing solutions.
