Dear Committee Members:

It is my distinct pleasure and honor to support the nomination of Mayor Joseph P. Riley of Charleston, South Carolina for the Olmsted Medal. For more than two decades Joe has provided leadership for the City of Charleston in protecting its built and natural environment. His leadership has had tremendous impact beyond the boundaries of his city. Throughout his tenure as mayor, and in every aspect of his public service, Joe Riley has exhibited a dedication to the ideals embodied in the Olmsted Medal. I can think of no more deserving individual for this honor.

Any list of Joe's accomplishments and qualifications in the area of design and stewardship must be prefaced by his guiding principle that every citizen deserves the best that can be done by his government. The pioneering scattered site public housing program of the early 1980's integrated public housing and its residents back into the community.
