Mr. Friedberg, landscape architect, product designer, educator, and writer, was born in New York in 1931. He received his Bachelor of Sciences from Cornell University in 1954 and served as First Lieutenant in the United States Army for 1954-56. Married Ester Louise Hidary in 1962; (widowed) August 1982, children: Mark and Jeffrey. Friedberg, a Cornell graduate, has been on the faculty of Columbia University, The New School for Social Research and Pratt Institute, as well as guest lecturer at numerous colleges throughout the United States and Canada. In 1983, he was awarded a honorary degree, doctor of law by Ball State University in recognition of his achievements as a Landscaping Architect, Scholar, educator and practioner. At present he is director (as well as founder) of the Urban Landscape Architecture Program at City College of New York — the first urban oriented undergraduate program in a major city.

Friedberg is a fellow of the American Society of Landscape Architects, and also serves as advisor to the institute of Urban Design and the International Design Conference in Aspen; he is a trustee of the American Academy in Rome, a member of the American Institute of Planners and CLARB; and is on the advisory board of the School of Architecture at Cornell. He was a founding partner in 1958 for M. Paul Friedberg and Partners, Landscape Architecture and Urban

His success is evident in the over sixty awards he and his firm have received from such varied organizations as H.U.D, A.I.A., A.S.L.A., the New York Council on the Arts, the Municipal Arts Society, etc.

In 1980 Mr. Friedberg received the AIA Medal in recognition of his inspiration and influence upon the architectural profession. In selecting Friedberg, the AIA Jury on Institute Honors commented, "Throughout his career, he has been able to introduce a new dimension of life for different ages and social groups in the urban environment. His work, which is a testimonial of his dedication to architecture and the human environment, should be taken as a parameter for the future."
