On behalf of Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards (CLARB), I would like to voice our support for the nomination of Wangari Muta Maathai for the ASLA Olmsted Medal. Her current position as the Assistant Secretary of the Environment, Wildlife and Natural Resources for Kenya and her life-long accomplishments for her country's environment make her an outstanding candidate for this honor.

Through the organization of the Green Belt Movement, Professor Maathai has focused efforts on improving the lives of the people in her country by repairing their environment. More than 20 million trees have been planted since 1976, and the work has been carried out mainly by women.
