ASLA Virtual Advocacy Day provides an opportunity for members to advocate before their federal legislators on issues important to the profession. This year, ASLA will schedule virtual meetings with legislators and staff.

Frequently Asked Questions

When is this year's ASLA Advocacy Day? Is it virtual?

This year's ASLA Advocacy Day will be held on June 10th. All congressional meetings, pre-event preparation, and advocacy training sessions (May 20 & June 3) will be virtual.

What do I get for the registration fee?

For just \$99, ASLA Virtual Advocacy Day takes you from design to action—giving you the tools and access to turn your expertise into real policy impact:

- **Meet:** Two meetings with Members of Congress and staff.
- **Prepare:** Two targeted trainings to refine your message.
- **Advance:** Two priority issues with ready-to-use advocacy toolkits.

How do participants register?

What is the theme and what issues will we discuss?

The theme is "Landscape Architects in Action." Landscape architects will advocate for bike/ped projects and community parks, which are all slated for elimination.

Who will schedule our meetings?

ASLA works with professional congressional schedulers. To prevent confusion, ASLA asks that participants do **not** reach out to congressional offices about meetings. ASLA will request meetings with legislators and staff.

How much time is needed to prepare?

ASLA suggests approximately 5-8 hours of preparation, including attending two webinars (May 20 & June 3), identifying local projects, self-study, and coordinating with chapter members.

Do participants need to be available all day on June 10th?

Yes. Participants should be available all day on June 10th to increase the chances of securing legislative meetings and to account for last-minute schedule changes.

How can I meet with my Members of Congress in person?
