State Policy Internships

The 117th Congress passed both the <u>Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act</u> and the <u>Inflation</u> <u>Reduction Act</u>. With those signed into law, now is the time to build and to focus on implementation. States governments will receive and administer the majority of these funds.

- Responsibilities may include:
 - Legislative Support: develop policy proposals, attend committee and caucus meetings, track legislation, draft press releases, understand floor debate and voting processes, and research issues
 - **Constituent Services**: constituent casework, negotiating with state agencies, and prepare material for weekly newsletters
 - Office Support: file documents, answer phones, prepare mail, welcome district visitors

Executive Branch: White House

- Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ)
 - Climate change, environmental justice, federal sustainability, public lands, oceans, and wildlife conservation, among other areas
 - CEQ interns may:
 - research policy issues
 - draft fact sheets, memos, and blogs
 - attend meetings with external stakeholders
- Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP)
 - Climate and Environment Team: advance climate, environmental justice, and nature
 - Energy Team: advances clean energy priorities and provides policy expertise on energy and net-zero emissions technologies
 - Science and Society Team: protect the integrity of science in the federal government, broaden participation in STEM fields, strengthen U.S. research infrastructure and its security, and ensure equitable access to the benefits of new and emerging technologies and scientific innovation
- Office of Management and Budget (OMB)
 - budget development and execution
 - management, including oversight of agency performance, procurement, financial management, and information technology
 - coordination and review of all significant Federal regulations from executive agencies
 - coordination of legislative and other materials
 - Presidential Executive Orders and memoranda to agency heads

Office of Administration (OA)

- Office of the Chief Administrative Officer (OCAO) provides human resource services, including:
 - design and communication services
 - learning and development
 - library and research services
- Office of the Chief Operations Officer (OCOO) provides operational services, including:
 - facility management
 - construction project management
 - interior design and space planning
 - logistics support
 - continuity of operations planning and execution
 - monitoring of internal and external events affecting the White House campus

General Information on White House Internship Program:

- Stipend of \$10,500 (full-time) or \$5,250 (part-time)
- Hosted in person on the White House campus
- Summer Internships
 - Applications open mid-January and close mid-February
 - Term begins early June and ends mid-August
- Fall Internships
 - Applications open mid-March and close mid-April
 - Term begins mid-September and ends mid-December

- Cover Letter
 - <u>Personalize this template</u>
 - Connect your experience to office's functions and goals
 - Emphasize relationship between design and policy work
 - Address to Individual (director, hiring manager, etc)
- Use your university alumni network
- LinkedIn
 - Message staffers, managers, recruiters, alumni
 - Informational interviews
 - Check connections—Friends? Friends of friends? Family? Colleagus?
