RE: H.R. 7024 Tax Relief for Families and Workers Act

Dear Chairman Smith, Ranking Member Neal, Chairman Kelly, and Ranking Member Thompson,

On behalf of the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) and its more than 15,000 members, I write to commend the bipartisan passage of H.R. 7024, the Tax Relief for Families and Workers Act. ASLA is especially pleased with Title 2, the American Innovation and Growth Act. This legislation will empower entrepreneurs nationwide, including many landscape architects, to advance technologies critical to American growth and prosperity.

As you know, the American Innovation and Growth Act will increase eligibility for small business landscape architects to access research and development (R&D) tax credits. Landscape architecture firms of all sizes invest in R&D to enhance outdoor spaces such as national and community parks, federal highways and other transportation corridors, coastal zones, agricultural lands, and more. In its recent awards programs, ASLA has recognized landscape architecture research achievements in engineered soil, sand, and gravel as well as seed germination, dredge material management, floating wetland performance, and climate adaptation of national natural landmark sites.

Landscape architects serve many types of communities nationwide, including urban, suburban, rural, small, and large communities. Landscape architects create outdoor spaces that are accessible for individuals of all ages, abilities, and socioeconomic



backgrounds. This bipartisan tax bill provision will help enhance these planning and design services by fostering growth of landscape architecture R&D.

Once again, ASLA commends the inclusion of the American Innovation and Growth Act in the passage of H.R. 7024. This legislation will spur investment into technology, materials, and methods that will enhance the nation's built and natural environment.
