It is a great pleasure to nominate **Daniel Martin** for <u>Honorary Membership</u> in the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA). I have the privilege of knowing and working with Daniel for several years. Though he is not educated or trained as a landscape architect, Daniel has a deep passion for and commitment to the profession and ASLA.

Daniel has been the Director of Marketing for **Permaloc Corporation** since 2004. Permaloc, based in Holland, MI, was founded and is owned by a landscape architect and is the world's leading manufacturer of high-performance landscape edging and restraint systems. Since 2013 Daniel has also been a partner in **Land8: Landscape Architects Network**, a social network for landscape architects with over 19,000 user profiles. Supported by millions of visitors and social media followers, Land8 promotes the profession of landscape architecture and provides a valuable resource for both professionals and those interested in the work of landscape architects.

Daniel is being nominated for Honorary Membership in recognition of his years of service in volunteer capacities at a national level with ASLA; service which has been impactful and yielded significant results.

• Since 2014 Daniel has served as the driving force behind ASLA's Student Chapter Leadership Program. Daniel has arranged and participated in 40 visits to 32 different university landscape architecture programs. From Massachusetts to Georgia, Florida, Arizona, California and many places in between, Daniel has brought together landscape architecture program faculty, staff and students with ASLA national leaders, including Immediate Past-Presidents. He works closely with university and student leaders to organize up to two days of engagement, including public lectures, meetings with LA program faculty, staff and student chapter members, informal conversations with students and studio visits or critiques. These visits have significantly strengthened ASLA's connection to academic programs, faculty, staff and emerging professionals.

- Daniel served on ASLA's Member Services Committee (2014-2016) and as Chair of the Emerging Professionals Committee (2016-2018). As Chair, Daniel initiated the 'Ask Me Anything' (AMA) series of web broadcasts. Each hour long episode features an interactive interview with a leading landscape architect. Daniel serves as moderator, guiding the discussion with questions from individuals logged into the broadcast. AMA has featured landscape architects Mia Lehrer, FASLA, Vaughn Rinner, FASLA (ASLA Past-President), Daniel Tal, ASLA and Barbara Deutsch, FASLA (Landscape Architecture Foundation) among many others. AMA serves as a great way for young professionals to connect to, learn about and from leaders of the profession. AMA broadcasts are archived and available on ASLA.org.
- For over a decade, Daniel has served as the 'guiding spirit' of LA Bash, the annual student-led landscape architecture conference. Each year Daniel works with students to solicit proposals to host LA Bash and guides the university selection process. He then works with students to select conference venues, topics and speakers. Daniel ensures that ASLA is prominently featured at LA Bash. A national ASLA leader, generally the President or Immediate Past-President, provides a keynote address and meets with attendees in informal settings. ASLA staff is also present to engage with students throughout the conference

Daniel's understanding of the profession, grasp of details, energy and easy demeanor make him a pleasure to work with. He has a strong connection to emerging professionals, understanding their aspirations and anxieties. All of his volunteer activities – student chapter visits, Emerging Professionals Committee, Ask Me Anything and LA Bash – are focused on addressing the needs of students and emerging professionals and strengthening their ties to the profession and ASLA.

Daniel's deep commitment to landscape architecture and ASLA is all the more noteworthy considering he was not educated or trained in the profession. Daniel exemplifies the description of an ASLA Honorary Member as a "person other than landscape architects whose achievements of national or international significance or influence have provided notable service to the profession of landscape architecture."

This nomination includes letters of support from four recent ASLA Past-Presidents, all of whom have work closely with Daniel – Gregory A. Miller, FASLA (2018), Vaughn B. Rinner, FASLA (2017), Chad D. Danos, FASLA (2016) and K. Richard Zweifel, FASLA (2015).
