## **Policy Statement**

The American Society of Landscape Architects believes the quality of visual character and scenic resources is critical to our landscapes and communities at the local, regional, and national level. The visual environment significantly impacts individual and societal quality of life as well as our economy. From wild, to rural, to urban environments, our natural, historic, and cultural resources are affected by all elements that have a perceptible presence in the landscape.
