Advocate

Definition

Advocate: the act of pleading for, supporting, or recommending; active espousal

Legislative

Be clear in the issue and "The ASK" for results. Know your legislators and their concerns.

Representation

Representation from a wide cross section of the chapter will bring more weight to the effort.



Build Coalitions

Leverage

Leverage members to create a larger constituency and build relationships with diversity.

Join

Join forces with other allied organizations to approach issues or policy challenges. Strength in numbers!

Create

Landscape architects are great at bringing together groups from a wide range of expertise to approach an issue. Use these connections to create coalitions.
