Relationship Type Definitions

1 – Barely Know

You have an indirect relationship with the Elected Official.

Example: You are a friend of a friend; or you know them in passing but they may not recognize you.

2 – Acquaintance

You have a loose connection to the Elected Official.

Example: You attended a College/University during the same year and had a class together, or you may have phone banked/volunteered for them in the past.

3 – Friendly

You are recognizable to the Elected Official.

Example: Your children attend school together or maybe you belong to the same civic organization.

4 – Close

You have the personal phone number or email of the Elected Official.

Example: You may have worked directly with the elected official in the past as colleagues. Or you may have attended their wedding.

5 – Very Close

You informally see or talk to the Elected Official on a regular basis.

Example: You have a familial relationship. You may have been roommates or are life-long childhood friends.

6 – Relationship w/ Staff and not the Elected Official

You have the personal phone number or email of their staff.
