For the tenth annual <u>HALS Challenge</u>, you are invited to document **historic streetscapes**. Many cities have come to appreciate the cultural and commercial value of their historic streets. What makes your favorite historic street(s) unique? Increase historic landscape awareness with your local governments and preservation commissions by documenting historic streetscapes for HALS and illuminating these significant parts of America's circulatory system.
