POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

Assistant Professor / Associate Professor / Professor in Landscape Architecture

The Department of Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning at Texas A&M University, College Station, TX invites applications for a full-time faculty position at the tenured Associate Professor or Full Professor level or at the tenure-track Assistant Professor level. The successful candidates will provide expertise in landscape architecture construction and technology. To be qualified for the tenured Associate Professor or Full Professor appointment, the candidates must demonstrate the evidence of exemplary teaching, research and or professional practice.

Qualifications and Responsibility

Candidates must have at least one professional degree in landscape architecture (BLA, MLA from an accredited program or equivalent). A Ph.D. and/or professional registration will be strongly preferred. Salary and rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The successful candidate must be qualified to teach core courses in both BLA and MLA programs. Priority will be given to candidates who are able to teach landscape architecture construction and site engineering plus one or more of the following subject areas:

- 1) Landscape architecture design studios
- 2) Professional practice in landscape architecture
- 3) Low impact development technology
- 4) Sustainable landscape technology

In addition to teaching undergraduate and/or graduate courses, the successful applicant should also demonstrate the evidence or potential to advance the profession through peer-reviewed research on evidence based design aspects of the discipline. The applicant will also be expected to serve on graduate student committees and contribute to the service requirement of the college, university and community.
